# *Grounded in Scripture, Surrounded by Community*

Some of you might remember the time a few weeks ago, on August 13, when Sarah Wolf, our Director of Young Adult Ministry, rudely interrupted me *in the midst of my sermon!* (For those of you who weren't there, you can probably Livestream it [sermon at 32:13]. And full disclosure: We had it all planned!)

Though we had some fun with it, the topic was serious, how Peter nearly drowned in the midst of a storm at night, only to have Jesus reach out his hand to rescue him.

I talked about “the dark night of the soul,” those times when darkness, fear, doubt, and even depression seem to take hold of our lives. The overall theme was that, even in darkness, God comes to us.

I spent a lot of time with this line of thought, because you and I ...and Sarah...all know something of those feelings, regardless of age, socio-economic level, race or gender. But also because someone that week asked me “So Steve, how have you managed to keep going amidst the darkness of our world?”

I shared two points: I simply don't think I could keep going without my faith, a faith that struggles with doubts and fears, to be sure, but a faith that is sustained by prayer, grounded in scripture, and surrounded by a community.

That's not a bad clarion call for a deeper participation in church as we begin a new year. *Prayer* is not simply my communicating with God, pleading, as Anne Lamott says: “Help me, thank you, and wow! But also listening for God communicating with me. Call it prayer, call it meditation, call it mindfulness, but much of it is in accord with the Psalmist: “Be still and know that I am God.”

*Grounded in scripture* doesn't mean we find all the answers to the mysteries of life in that sacred book, but when some fundamental pastors take isolated texts and hit people over the head with it, or (as they have in the past few weeks) to justify not only racism, misogyny, and homophobia, but also claiming that our president has a mandate from God to drop a nuclear bomb on North Korea, we need to at least be aware of the grand themes of scripture. It has helped me to find my own story in these age old stories. For I find that the Bible reads me more than I read the Bible!

*And surrounded by a community.* I need to know that I am not alone. I need a place where I can be free to share my heresies without judgment, or to share my vulnerabilities and doubts. Most importantly, I need to be surrounded by people who remind me that though there is darkness in the world, there are many, many, many good people doing good things. I lift them up daily.

Let me give an example. I have experienced that “dark night of the soul” as I have talked with my Latino friends, some of whose fathers and husbands have been deported, despite claims that ICE is only going after hardened criminals. It is discouraging, even depressing.

But after a meeting with their leaders in which they asked us to show support to students going back to school, we had about 50 Idlewild members and friends show up at Brewster Elementary School. It was one of the most moving spiritual experiences I have had in quite some time.

Standing next to me was Ben Clark. He and his wife Meghan moved here from Charlotte this year, along with their two precious girls, Sloane and Mae. Ben was holding a sign his children made with their hand prints in various colors surrounding the words “Bienvenidos” and “Welcome.” Ben said that Sloane, his three year old, didn't fully understand the situation, but she did realize that she was doing this “to make other children happy.”

Out of the mouths of babes comes a clarion call to get involved in the faith community!

Thanks be to God.



## Come See the Updated Building Plans!




## This Month's Very Special Clean Water Mission Trip to Ghana

Over a billion people in the world do not have reasonable access to safe drinking water. That's 1 in 7 people whose only option is to drink contaminated water. Eighty percent of all illnesses in the developing world can be attributed to unsafe water, and contaminated water is the #1 killer of children worldwide—more than AIDS, more than malaria. Every 60 seconds, a child dies from a preventable waterborne disease. The statistics are staggering, and behind them are names and faces and stories intimately known by God.

From September 22 through October 3, our clean water team will travel to Ghana to install a water purification system. This will be the eighth system installed by Idlewild since 2006—a long-term project which has involved a total of 21 Idlewild members. This year's team members are Forrest and Shari Gross, Jim Levernier, and Steve and Chalmers Valentine.

This trip is especially poignant for the team, as they will be joined by Living Waters for the World instructors and tasked with training their Ghanaian partners, who will in turn train other Ghanians. The shift will not only empower the local people, but will make the systems more sustainable, ultimately granting clean water access to more people.

This is sacred work, sustained not only by those who will be in Ghana, but by each of us who pray for them, their Ghanaian partners, and the fruit of their work. Please join us in prayer.
