



2018 Campouts are overnight educational programs where guests spend the night in platform canvas tents (with cots, rugs, nightstands, and lanterns) and enjoy learning about what happens at the Lee G. Simmons Conservation Park and Wildlife Safari after dark. The Campout includes educational programming, overnight stay, park admission, evening hike, evening snack, light breakfast, and animal visit. Guests are also welcome to bring their own tents and extra food if they prefer. Cost is \$40 per person with reservations required. This is a beginners and experienced camping event. Pre-Campers Campouts

This family program focuses on families of all ages. We will discover what spending the night at the Wildlife Safari Park is all about without actually spending the night. Geared towards the beginner campers and young explorers. Event starts at 4:30pm and concludes at 8:30pm. Guests will experience a night hike, dinner, evening snack and campfire. Cost is \$25 per person (children under 1 are free). Adult participation required.

Private Campouts

Private Campouts are available for schools, churches, scouts, summer camps, families and more with a minimum of 15 people and can be reserved for any open date (April through October). Campouts include educational programming, free day at the park, overnight stay, evening hike, evening snack, morning light breakfast, and animal visit. Guests will spend the night at the campsite with platform canvas tents, cots, a rug, nightstand, and lantern. Groups are asked to bring their own bedding, flashlights, chairs, and bug spray. Please note that the Wildlife Safari Park allows food and non-alcoholic drinks to be brought into park especially during overnights. Groups are welcome to bring coolers and extra supplies as well as their own tents (if they want). Cost is \$40 per person with reservations made a minimum of three weeks in advance. One adult required per tent and a minimum of 4 years of age to participate.

Geocaching Campouts

Walk in the footsteps of Conservation Biologists as you find clues to a possible new species at the park. Guests will use GPS devices to find caches that hold hints of the animal your tracking. GPS devices provided along with navigation training. This private Campout is available for groups 15 participants or more. Program includes educational programming, overnight stay, park admission, evening snack, light breakfast and animal visit. Cost is \$55 per person and reservations are required. Haunted Safari Campout - \$55 October 6

Campout combines Haunted Safari Event and overnight stay at the Wildlife Safari Park's Campsite. Guests will experience Haunted Safari Event, educational programming, overnight stay (in a platform canvas tent with cots), park admission, dinner, evening snack, light breakfast, and animal visit. Price is \$55 per person. 1 adult required per tent. Guests are also welcome to bring their own tents to use if they want.
