Would you like to take part in uncovering our local history?

For years, St. Andrew's own Harry King has been discovering ancient artifacts along the Ft. Morgan Road. You'll recall the shells he has found that date to the time of Christ. Perhaps his most astonishing find is the remains of a man-made canal that once ran from Oyster Bay to the Little Lagoon. Recently this canal was dated to 566 AD. As he puts it, "When Rome was burning and Europe was in the dark ages, our local Indians were accomplishing the complicated engineering feat of excavating a one-mile-long trade canal."

Harry has discovered the oldest canal in North America and the first Intracoastal Waterway. "It connected the copper-rich areas of Michigan down the Mississippi to Mobile Bay, through our trade canal to Little Lagoon, then east to Pensacola Bay, Choctawhatchee Bay north to the Flint River, and up to the Appalachian Mountains near Atlanta."

Now the Smithsonian Institution is getting involved. This fall, Harry and Dr. Greg Waselkov of the University of South Alabama will lead an excavation of the canal and nearby burial mounds. They need volunteers to dig!
