PASTORAL PRAYER

REFORMATION AFFIRMATIONS

Rom. 3:23-24; Gal. 2:16; 1 Peter 1:23-25; John 14:6; Acts 4:12; Eph. 3:20-21
(all, standing)

All: The Protestant Reformation of the sixteenth century was a tremendous movement of spiritual and ecclesiastical renewal which called the church back to its biblical and evangelical roots. As heirs of this great tradition, we reaffirm on this Reformation Sunday the principles for which our forebears in the faith struggled, and by which they lived and died.

Leader: *Sola Gratia* (by Grace alone)

People: “For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus.”

Leader: *Sola Fide* (by Faith alone)

People: “Nevertheless knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the Law but through faith in Christ Jesus, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we may be justified by faith in Christ, and not by the works of the law; since by the works of the Law shall no flesh be justified.”

Leader: *Sola Scriptura* (the Scriptures alone)

People: “You have been born again, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding word of God; for ‘All flesh is like grass and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord remains forever.’”

Leader: *Sola Christus* (through Christ alone)

People: “Jesus said to him, ‘I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me.’” “And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.”

Leader: *Soli Deo Gloria* (Glory to God alone)

People: “Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.”
