"With Freedom Comes Responsibility"

When I was a young boy growing up, I remember around the time of the July 4th every year that the local Piggly Wiggly grocery story would print on its paper bags (yes, it was that long ago!) a picture of the U.S. flag, followed by the words, "With Freedom Comes Responsibility." It was a reminder that even though we enjoy the benefits and blessings of living in a free country, we should not take those freedoms for granted, nor should we abuse them. Having the freedom of speech does not mean I get to yell "Fire!" in a crowded theater or that I get to slander someone. We have a responsibility to use our basic freedoms rightly.

In Galatians 5:13, the Apostle Paul writes, "For you were called to freedom, brethren; only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." The Christians in the Galatian churches had heard the gospel of free grace in Jesus Christ, but false teachers had come in, preaching a message of Christ plus works (basically, the requirement to submit to various Jewish laws and customs, including circumcision and observing Jewish holy days, before one could become a Christian). Instead of enjoying the freedom of being declared to be sons of God through faith in Jesus Christ (Galatians 3:26), they were being tempted to leave the promise of sonship behind in order to become slaves all over again (Galatians 4:1-9). Paul was warning the Galatians that even though there is true freedom in the Lord Jesus Christ, this freedom must not be abused. Their freedom did not give them the right to corrupt the gospel or to hate one another (see Galatians 5:14-15). As John Calvin observes here, we should not "grow wanton, but use the grace of God for his honor and the salvation of our neighbors."

Certainly none of us would ever claim that the grace God gives us the right to dishonor God, or to change the truth of the gospel, or to mistreat one another. Yet, that is exactly what was happening among the Galatians. It is a reminder to us how easily it is to fall into the old ways of sin rather than enjoying the actual freedom that salvation in the Lord Jesus Christ brings with it.

How can we abuse our freedom in Christ? One way we see this in our day is the idea that freedom from the condemnation of God's law means we have a right to ignore the moral law of God. In other words, some might use the freedom that the gospel brings as an excuse to sin. Yet Paul says the law is fulfilled in loving our neighbor as ourselves (Galatians 5:14; see also Leviticus 19:18). We cannot use the gospel as an excuse to break God's moral law by sinning against others. Neither can we use the gospel as excuse to do our own thing and dishonor God. For example, at the adult Bible study during VBS last month, we saw that we have duties as Christian to read God's word, to pray, and to attend worship. It is not legalism to say we should be doing these things. They are not merely helpful suggestions, but should be as basic to us as the food we eat or the air we breathe. None of these saves us (only God can do that, through the atoning work of Jesus Christ), but they should flow from our salvation. They are part of the responsibility that comes from being in Christ. They are among

the means God has given to us to help us grow in Christ. Neglecting them is not an exercise in our freedom, nor does it honor God.

By the time you read this article, July will be over. Even though we are easing into August, do not forget the freedoms you celebrated this past month on Independence Day, and remember what it cost for us to live in a free nation. Enjoy your freedom and salvation in Jesus Christ every week, and remember the even greater cost of the death of God's own Son that it took for us to be free from the condemnation and power of sin. In Jesus there is true freedom, and with that freedom comes responsibility.
