DID YOU KNOW...

- The McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System (MKARNS) is a 445 river mile navigation channel running from Catoosa, OK to the Mississippi River!
- There are 18 locks and dams along the MKARNS managed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers!
- The industrial park at the Port of Catoosa has around 70 companies, and over 3,500 people working there.



The Port of Catoosa is an industrial park northeast of Tulsa, at the end of a constructed waterway known as the McLellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System. It extends from the Mississippi River to the Port of Catoosa, enabling ocean-going barges to travel more deeply into the interior of the country. It is referred to as the most inland ocean-going port in the nation.
